### Frequently Asked Questions – Film and Movie Industry Temporary Signage

This handout has been prepared by the City of Peachtree City to assist the staff, citizens, and the film industry in understanding the requirements and issues related to temporary signs within city limits. The following answers were obtained from the Peachtree City Code of Ordinances, Chapter 66, Signs.

### What licenses/permits does the City require to install temporary directional signs for film crews?

- The City requires that film companies fill out and submit a temporary sign permit application for placing signs within the city. Permitted signs will need to follow Peachtree City ordinances. See outlined process below
- 2. In Peachtree City, it is unlawful for any person or business to place signs in a State-owned Right of Way (ROW) without permission from the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT). ## What are the requirements for obtaining a Temporary Sign Permit for filming activities?

- 1. <u>Permit Application.</u> Each registrant shall be required to fill out a registration form giving:
  - a. <u>Complete applicant identification.</u> Name, address, phone, email, signature.
  - b. Name of film company he/she is representing.
  - c. Project Name. Film or project name.
  - d. <u>Filming Duration.</u> Permits will be good for one filming season.
  - e. <u>Drawing/Rendering</u>. Photo or drawing that shows dimensions and colors of temporary signs.
  - f. Any other identification or information as may be required by the Chief of Police.
- 2. <u>GDOT Approval Letter.</u> Any signs placed in the Georgia Department of Transportation's right of way will need a written letter of approval from GDOT. District 3 Traffic Operation; 706-646-6676
- Signs in the ROW | Restrictions. According to the Peachtree City sign ordinance, per section 66-18(a) no signs shall be placed in the public right of way, except as otherwise provided in Chapter 66 and as follows:
  - Temporary signs shall be permitted in all zoning districts.
  - Temporary signs shall be freestanding and not attached to any building, post or structure other than those approved within this chapter.
  - All signs permitted within city-owned right of way shall be approved based on:
    - Color. Signs with a standard yellow background and black font are preferred; other colors are permitted upon request

with approval from GDOT.

- 2. <u>Size.</u> Signs shall not exceed 18" x 24" in size. Signs shall be posted on a stake or stand so as not to exceed a total height of 36" from finish grade to the top of the sign.
- 3. <u>Duration.</u> If filming on location, all signs shall be removed at the end of the day on the last day of filming at that location.
- Location. All permitted temporary signs shall be placed a minimum of five feet (5') and a maximum of ten feet (10') from the edge of pavement or back of curb, and shall not obstruct vehicular, pedestrian or golf cart traffic in any manner.
- d. Unless the applicant has express written permission from GDOT, permitted temporary signs shall not be placed within any median strip, along the rights of way of State Routes 54 or 74, or within the right of way of any street within 200 feet of any intersection with State Routes 54 and 74.

#### How long can the temporary signs be up?

Every effort shall be made by the production company to <u>pick up signs at the end of the day of filming</u>. This not only provides citizens with an uncluttered city, but it also prevents the film location from being overrun with onlookers and crowds.

#### Does the city require anything on the sign?

Yes. The city only requires the current permit number on the bottom right corner of the sign. This will allow Code Enforcement Officers to verify the signs within the rightof-way have a current and approved permit.

### What happens if I do not get a permit for temporary signs?

According to Section 66-18 (f): Forfeiture of signs. Any sign installed or placed on public property, except in conformance with the requirements of this section, shall be forfeited to the public and subject to confiscation. In addition to other remedies hereunder, the city shall have the right to recover from the owner or person placing or maintaining such a sign the full costs of removal and disposal of such sign. This cost shall be the same as that established by city council for a sign permit application submittal fee. If you believe your signs have been confiscated, please contact Code Enforcement at 770-487-5731.

#### Do I need to contact the Police Department?

If filming will impact traffic in any way, you are filming on a public path or roadway, or you wish to hire an off-duty officer, please contact the Peachtree City Police Department at 770-487-8866.

#### NOTE:

Any sign that does not have a permit or does not follow the above regulations shall be confiscated and charged a recovery fee of **\$100 per sign**.
